

What size of band should I book?

We operate as a three piece band. This includes male and female lead vocalists, two guitarists and keyboards. Most bands with more members than us include a Bass Player and Drummer. Our Bass and drums are played by our Sequencers/Synthesisers.

This allows us to offer a more professional sound at a lesser price. If you book a five piece or larger band you are effectively paying for the live bass player and drummer. Most wedding guests never notice the difference. Because all of our instruments are electronic we can “scale” our sound to suit your wedding venue meaning we are never going to be too loud.

Should I book a Ceilidh Band?

You should ask yourself “How much Accordion Music can I/my friends take?” In all the years we have played weddings we’ve never needed to play more than half-a-dozen Ceilidh songs.

Ah, but what about a Ceilidh band AND a Disco.

The first half of the night, the people who can’t do/don’t like Ceilidh music are either at the bar getting pissed or sitting blethering. Later when the Disco comes on your Aunties etc. stampede for the door, while the younger ones are all pissed from standing at the Bar while the Ceilidh band was on. Why should you need to wait until the end of the night for a boogie?

So what makes you so special?

We have years of experience of gauging an audience and quickly sussing out what they like. The trick is to play a variety of music –fast,slow,modern,old,Scottish, particularly early on. This gives *all* of your wedding guests a chance of getting up and enjoying themselves (what they came for)

A Disco is cheaper though.

So is getting married in a T-Shirt and Jeans.

Your Wedding is a one-off occasion(hopefully). Apart from the Ceremony itself, your evening reception is probably the most important part of your day (we think so anyway). People enjoy listening and dancing to a good band, a good singer, they will REMEMBER your wedding. Anybody can play CDs.
